

ORANGUTAN





One of the largest tree dwelling animals

Builds its nest high up in the trees using branches and leaves every evening





Uses its long arms to swing easily through the trees





Uses a loud, distinct call to 'talk' to its friends over long distances

#### ELEPHANT






Spends more than half the day eating



It eats fruits, leaves and grass that are found in the rainforest. An elephant can eat up to 200kg of food a day!




## PROTECTING THE RAINFOREST
