





This resource helps reinforce your students' learning from the Adventure in Rainforest Wild ASIA Virtual Show. It is design to spark conversations, promote active listening, and get children excited about exploring the park with respect and care.

In this resource pack, you will find:

# 1. Explorer Ears Craft Activity

Create giant Explorer Ears to remind students to use their listening skills during nature exploration.

### 2. Forest Adventure Guide

Recap the behaviours of a good nature explorer as a class when preparing to go outdoors.

## **Activity 1**





A good explorer uses all senses when exploring a nature space. You may not always see animals, but you might hear them! Create giant Explorer Ears and bring them on your next trip outdoors to remind your students to listen to the sounds of nature.

**Objective:** To practice listening skills and become more aware of the sounds and movements in their surroundings

#### **Instructions:**

**1.** Look closely at your ear in the mirror.

Observe the lines and shapes that make your ears unique



**2.** Draw the shape of your ears out on a paper.




**3.** Cut it out, then decorate it

Use colors, patterns, or textures inspired by the rainforest



**4.** Punch a hole at the top and add a string

**5.** Bring your Explorer Ear to the park and listen closely to the things around you









## **Instructions:**

Remind your students that their Explorer Ears can be like a discovery tool to help them notice what's around them by listening carefully.

When outdoors, prompt your students with the phrase, "I hear with my Explorer Ear..." and get them to complete the sentence by describing what they hear.




# FOREST ADVENTURE CUIDE



1 Keep a safe distance from the animals and listen quietly.

When we're quiet and keep our hands to ourselves, animals feel safe, and we might spot more of them!



No eating in places where signs say not to and always hold on to your trash.

Curious animals might think your snacks are their food, but our snacks aren't healthy for them!



3 Keep yourself safe –
if it starts to rain, remember
to put on your raincoat and
find a dry spot to stay under!

A red flashing light tells us that there may be lighting strikes. It means it is time to find a shelter.



4 Always stay on designated paths.

Follow the tree markers and stay on the path so we don't get lost.
